Images and Ideas in Modern French Piano Music Jan 26 2020 In our visually-oriented society, music appears to stand apart from other arts. Yet just as a poet can write a poem whose form is a painting, so musicians have composed scores based on poems, paintings, and other non-musical art forms. In instrumental music such reinterpretations are especially intriguing as the verbal or visual stimulus does not appear in performance but is rendered in musical form.
