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**The Army and the Indonesian Genocide** Aug 23 2021 For the past half century, the Indonesian military has depicted the 1965-66 killings, which resulted in the murder of approximately one million unarmed civilians, as the outcome of a spontaneous uprising. This formulation not only denied military agency behind the killings, it also denied that the killings could ever be understood as a centralised, nation-wide campaign. **A Preliminary Analysis of the October 1, 1965 Coup in Indonesia** Jul 02 2022 Although numerous accounts have been published of the genesis and character of the attempted October 1965 coup in Indonesia, many important aspects of that affair still remain very unclear. The fact that in most accounts so much of the picture has been painted in black and white, and in language of categorical certainty, has served only to paper over the enormous gaps in established knowledge of the event. In his present introduction to the paper here published, Professor Anderson describes the circumstances surrounding its preparation and the reasons why it was not previously published. Indeed, because of the avowedly tentative and provisional character of this early effort, there would normally be no reason to publish it any more than there would have been to publish the scores of other preliminary drafts prepared over the years by scholars working in the Cornell Modern Indonesia Project. However, this draft has been given a unique prominence. For it has been singled out by a number of those who have subsequently written accounts of the attempted coup, among whom all too many have misrepresented the authors' ideas and cited words or phrases of theirs out of context. Thus there are special reasons now for publishing this draft in its entirety - in fairness both to the authors and to all those interested in the events of 1965 - so that readers can make their own assessments rather than having to rely upon doctored extracts and tendentious interpretations by writers hostile to the hypotheses advanced by its authors. I have found myself in disagreement with some of the views presented in this paper; however, I believe that despite the limited materials available to the authors over the few months that they collected and analyzed their data, this draft, which they wrote at the end of 1965, contains a number of important insights and a considerable amount of significant data which other writers have not taken into account. Thus, those interested in understanding the attempted coup of 1965, particularly if they bear in mind the caveats of Professor Anderson's present introduction, should find this paper useful. - George McT. **Kudeta Mekkah** Jun 20 2021 Pada 20 November 1979, sebuah peristiwa besar terjadi di Kota Suci Mekkah. Merujuk fatwa para ulama berpengaruh, Pemerintah Saudi mendakwa mereka melakukan tindakan sesat: mendeklarasikan munculnya Imam Mahdi--yang tewas dalam pertempuran itu--sebagai penyelamat dunia; serta menguasai dan menjadikan Masjid al-Haram, tempat tersuci umat Muslim, sebagai medan pertempuran dan kekerasan, yang sangat jelas dilarang oleh agama. Peristiwa itu menjadi bagian penting dari sejarah modern Kota Mekkah. Meski demikian, kebanyakan orang, terutama kaum Muslim, tak paham apa yang sejatinya terjadi saat itu. Maklum, ketika peristiwa itu berlangsung, Pemerintah Saudi melarang keras media massa meliput dan memberitakannya. Tak hanya itu, jaringan telepon, telegram, dan surat-menyurat pun diputus. Alhasil, tak ada celah bagi siapa pun untuk dapat mengakses peristiwa itu dari luar tempat kejadian. Pada tahun 2006, dua puluh tahun kemudian, Yaroslav Trofimov berusaha menyusun kembali serpihan sejarah atas kejadian itu. Untuk menyibak detail peristiwa yang tak terkuak khalayak itu, Trofimov memburu sumber-sumber penting dan tepercaya, antara lain: pelaku 'gerakan 1979' yang masih hidup; Paul Barril, kepala misi pasukan Prancis saat itu; tentara Arab Saudi; Perpustakaan British, satu-satunya tempat di Eropa yang menyimpan pelbagai surat kabar Saudi tahun 1979; arsip Pemerintah AS dan Inggris yang berisi laporan rahasia dari para diplomat dan mata-mata; serta CIA dan British Foreign Office. Para pengamat politik dan sejarawan menganggap kejadian itu sebagai insiden lokal semata dan karena itu tak bersangkutan-paut dengan peristiwa internasional yang belakangan merebak: terorisme. Tetapi penulis buku ini, Yaroslav Trofimov, berpendapat sebaliknya. Menurutnya, peristiwa itu merupakan akar sejarah gerakan terorisme global, terutama yang dimotori al-Qaeda.
